Copies of the book will be for sale in Runnymede's office in Suite 400.



Dear Members,

Three hundred Pearl Homes...five hundred Pearl Homes...a thousand Pearl Homes... Can you imagine it? I can easily imagine a thousand Pearl Homes in our watershed. I think there are at least a thousand families right now who would already qualify for our Pearl Home Award.

The Lynnhaven River's sixty-four square mile watershed is home to schools, shopping centers and malls, a hospital, office buildings, large roads, smaller streets, and high rise condominiums and apartments. But the most dominant land use in our watershed, at least 75%, is single-family homes. We know that the many daily decisions that each of us make regarding our own homes and property have a big effect on the quality of the water in the Lynnhaven River. We also know that Lynnhaven River families have worked hard to adopt new water-friendly practices.

This fall we are launching our Pearl Home program. Through this program we will recognize families in Virginia Beach who are making good choices, changing behaviors and conscientiously adapting new practices. We all benefit from their efforts. And we are encouraging everyone to consider what things you can do to help us restore and protect the Lynnhaven River that we love. Please review the information on the new Pearl Home program in this newsletter. Check off the items on the list that you are already doing and count them up. If you have checked off 15 items, you already qualify as a Pearl Home. If you don't have 15 yet, go back and look at the list again and consider what you may be able to add.

Where can I get a rain barrel? What is a rain garden? How do I know if this shrub is a native? Where can I get a Scoop the Poop sticker? Why is buying locally important? How can I dispose of hazardous waste? How can I get a soil test? These are just some of the questions you may have about how to implement the practices in our Pearl Home brochure. There are several ways to find answers to these questions. Our LRNow website, www.LRNow. org, has many of the answers. In the Pearl Homes brochure, there is a list of other websites that provide a wealth of information about good gardening practices, native plants, and much more.

Or, for an easy way to learn more about all of these topics, enjoy some good local food and fun activities for children, come to our FALL FESTIVAL on Saturday, November 5th at Virginia Beach Middle School, 600 25th Street. This event is free and open to the public. There will be a Lynnhaven River Passport for children and a gift for a completed Passport. We will be collecting our first Pearl Home applications and giving out Pearl Home lawn flags to every family that turns in a qualifying application.

Join the effort. Join the fun. And let us thank you for all the great things you are doing to restore and protect our environment in Virginia Beach.
